TADAMON

The Islamic Solidarity Fund for Development (ISFD), and the Islamic Development Bank (ISDB), the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation joined forces for a special event spotlighting the <u>NGO Empowerment for Poverty Reduction Programme (Tadamon)</u> during the upcoming 78th session of the UN General Assembly (UNGA). This event will showcase the achievements and lessons learned during the first phase of the Tadamon programme and how innovation, alternative finance and sustainable development can empower civil society organizations (CSOs).

Background:

Access to finance is critical for CSOs, and traditional ways of financing are often not sufficient or adequate for expanding their innovative projects. To fill the gap, there has been an increase in the use of alternative finance business models and novel initiatives striving to harness innovative financing, driven by factors such as increased internet penetration, rising smartphone usage, and a growing entrepreneurial spirit. Among them are crowdfunding platforms, used for a variety of purposes, including supporting small businesses and startups, funding social and community projects, and assisting individuals with medical expenses or personal needs. Blockchain or crypto-based solutions have also been used to improve financial inclusion, facilitate remitancess or cross-border transfers, or hedge against the inflation.

At the heart of the Tadamon initiative lies a deep commitment to eradicating poverty and uplifting communities. Through its programmes, Tadamon supports local CSOs in their mission to improve the socio-economic wellbeing of marginalized communities. Sponsored by ISFD, managed by IsDB, and implemented by UNDP, the programme operates across 33 Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) Member Countries by leveraging innovative approaches and alternative mechanisms, and fostering collaboration. With over 3,500 CSOs having joined Tadamon to drive transformational change, the programme runs a series of initiatives, including a Crowdfunding Academy, which has equipped 450 CSOs with skills in management, innovative financing, and crowdfunding, and the Tadamon Accelerator, which has supported 50 CSOs from 30 countries with training and \$460,000 in grants. In six months, \$2.2 million has been raised to support 80 campaigns and CSOs.

Goal:

The objective of the event is to bring together a diverse range of stakeholders and partners to highlight and explore different ways of harnessing innovation and alternative financing mechanisms to empower CSOs to further their mission in addressing a range of critical development issues, and identify the gaps and needs to further strengthen CSO capacity, foster innovation in tackling poverty reduction-related challenges and ensure sustainable financing for those on the frontlines.

Objectives:

- Spotlight exceptional CSOs and their work, how they are tapping into community engagement and innovative approaches to tackle issues from poverty to health, as well as probe existing systemic challenges to their work on the ground and potential solutions;
- Explore avenues to leverage innovative financing mechanisms and alternative finance platforms for financing the SDGs, involving various stakeholders – from high-tech companies and crowdfunding platforms to development organizations and governments;
- Showcase the achievements, impact and lessons learned thus far from Tadamon 2019-2024 and explore next steps, challenges and priorities for the programme's second phase in strengthening local ecosystems and support for CSOs;
- **Explore existing and new partnerships** to strengthen collaboration, and foster synergies and collective efforts in supporting and empowering CSOs.
